## Air Quality Advisory Unhealthy Conditions

For the following areas:

HUMBOLDT COUNTY: Hoopa, Willow Creek

## TRINITY COUNTY: Weaverville, Big Bar, Junction City, Trinity Center, Lewiston, Trinity Pines, Wildwood, Mad River, Dinsmore, Burnt Ranch

Smoke levels in these areas have been classified as *Unhealthy* and are creating a health hazard. Depending upon your proximity to the fires, smoke concentrations could range from Unhealthy to Hazardous throughout the day. These conditions are problematic for those with health conditions. Smoke Levels continue to be monitored. Please watch for updates.

## People are recommended to restrict outdoor activity.

Symptoms that may be related to excess smoke exposure include:

- Repeated coughing
- Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- Wheezing
- Chest tightness or pain
- Palpitations
- Nausea or unusual fatigue
- Lightheadedness
